# Raku Glazes from the Redcliffe workshop

### **Turquoise Lustre**

Frit 4110 100 Copper Carb 3 Bentonite 2 Tin Oxide 3

(Works in light reduction - suggest sawdust only)

### **Fergusons White Crackle**

Gerst Borate 65 Neph Sy 20 Kaolin 5 Silica 10

(Leave out in open air for 10 to 12 seconds before heavy reduction - suggest newspaper)

### **Copper Raku**

Frit 4101 100 Copper Oxide 3

### **Blue Raku**

Frit 4101 98 Cobalt oxide 5

### **Rainbow Raku**

Gerst Borate 80 Neph Sy 20 Copper Carb 4 Cobalt oxide 2.5

### Red Lustre #2

Gerst Borate 38
Borax 28
Silica 12.5
Neph Sy 12.5
Copper Carb 10
Iron oxide 10

### Naked Raku (peel away slip)

Fireclay 60 Kaolin 20 Silica 15 Grog 5

(this should be a thick batter mixture. Coat pieces just before putting in kiln. Glaze will harden in heat. Reduce in newspaper. Peel away hard shell of glaze when cool - use a metal rib) \*Clay shed can assist with fireclay & grog.

25 July we hired the Neighbourhood Centre's bus for a trip to Redcliffe to join the Redcliffe Potters in a Raku workshop.

The Redcliffe Potters were very generous with their glazes and time.
