The Siliceous Awards in March at the Brisbane Institute of Art (BIA) at Windsor with entries from throughout Australia.


CAQ members' exhibition in November, also at BIA.



Chords of Compassion workshop





Kelly and Mardi lead us through meditation, accompanied by the soothing sounds of Tibetan bowls (see above).

This was followed by a drawing session with our response to "what is compassion". A huge variety of media were supplied for us to use and explore.

Finally we decorated our bowls with a selection of glazes and underglazes.

Spiral wedging

Spiral wedging is one way to prepare clay for making pottery. It is more advanced than ram's head wedging but it allows you to wedge more clay at one time. It takes practice to master but if you follow the steps below you should have a great start to spiral wedging your clay. There are two major benefits to spiral wedging clay:

Remove Air Bubbles

Air bubbles in clay can cause the wall of a pot to become weaker or uneven. Air bubbles can also cause issues when the pots are fired. Spiral wedging is a great way to remove air bubbles from your clay.

Even Consistency

Clay that is old, recycled, or reused can have hard or soft spots in the clay. If two different kinds of clay are being mixed you often want the clay to be mixed completely. Ram's head wedging is great for mixing clay so it becomes one even consistency throughout.
