

Leave some lemon juice in it for 24 hours to see if it discolours - leaching out oxides.

Consensus was not to risk it but keep as a display piece.

Book Delivery!


Exciting parcel delivery from my parent's friend Judi Miles, a modern artist and Professor with national recognition up and down the East coast.

Ray Cavill's Clay School


What an absolutely pleasant surprise it was to visit the Clay School Winter Event in June.

Craft your own tools

Ceramics tools can get expensive!

While you work on building up your stash, repurpose everyday items to make essential tools. Many of the materials are probably already available in your home.

Create tools with the following:

- Unfolded paper clips taped to a wooden stick make great needle tools.
- Bamboo skewers or plastic forks aid with scoring.
- Used-up gift cards make sturdy ribs.
- Plastic bags cut into pieces make a chamois substitute.
- Sponges attached to sticks make water removal efficient on the wheel.
- Unused tarps or thick plastic drop cloths can make DIY waterproof aprons.
