Know your clay

What is the type of clay you have suitable for?

Quite often the information is on the bag the clay was packed in.

On the example on the right the box ticked is for RGH which has the information on:


The fired colour - Red Iron Stoneware

The fineness of the clay indicated by the mesh number #60 - medium texture.

The bisque temperature - Cone 06 ~1000°C

And glaze temperature - Cone 8 to 10 \sim 1270 to 1300°C
